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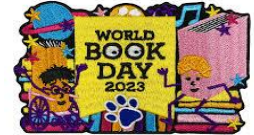

It's that time of year again...World Book Day, 2023! And this year, on **Thursday 2nd March**, it is the 26th year of celebrations about books on this special day! As always at Little Hill, the message for our children is 'you are a reader', and our World Book Day will be filled with ways to promote reading for pleasure. A few things that you can do at home in preparation for our World Book Day.

Dressing up

Deciding on what to wear to school on World Book Day. There are two options this year:

1. Dressing up as a fictional book character. Will you be the supermarket superhero 'Supertato', science-mad Rocket from 'Look Up' or Thanatos the immortal death daemon from 'Who Let The Gods Out'? The world of books is your oyster!
